

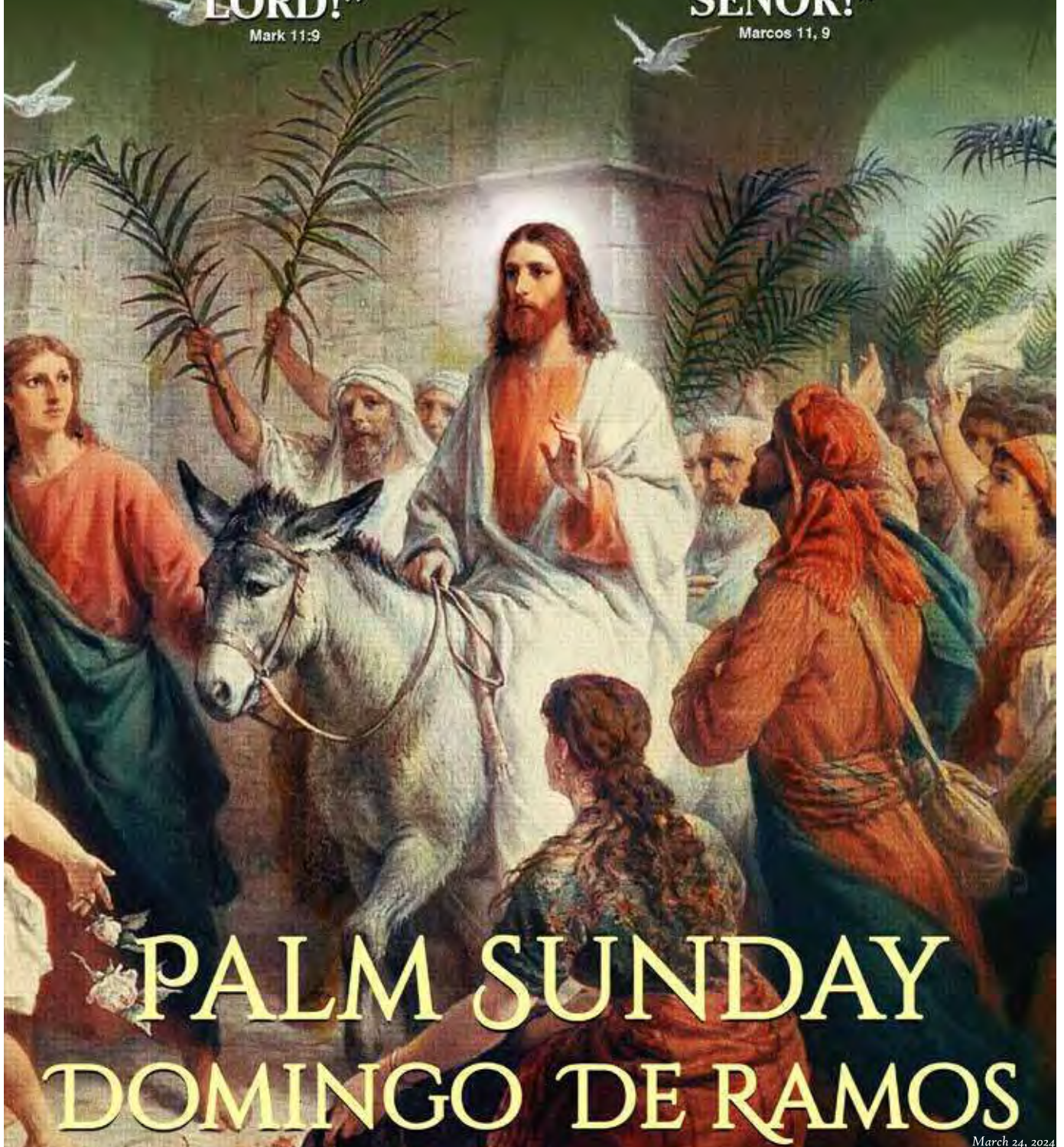

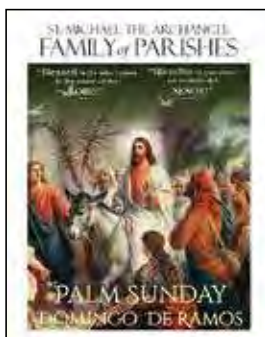

MARCH 24, 2024

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Beloved in Christ,

Sunday begins Holy Week, so we receive from the Archdiocese an important reminder:

Good Friday, March 29, is a day of abstinence from meat and also a day of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252).

“Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind.” (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110)

With regard to the obligatory days; however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. To paraphrase Pope John Paul II: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or “substantially,” the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord’s call to penance and conversion.

Many parishioners are participating in a nine-month novena for the protection and conversion of the world. I invite you to visit novena.cardinalburke.com to find out more and join this prayerful movement.

Since March 25 falls during holy week, the solemnity of the Annunciation gets moved to April 8, the ninth day of Easter. The Annunciation is both super important and super forgotten at the same time. First, why is it super important? It is the beginning of the life of Jesus. It is the beginning of our redemption, his priesthood, his gift of self. It marks huge mysteries pondered by Christians for millennia: the Incarnation, and the Hypostatic Union. That is: before the Annunciation, God did not have a body. From the moment of the Annunciation forward for all eternity, God now has a body in the person of Jesus Christ.

How is the Annunciation forgotten? Much like this year, it gets moved 38% of the time, which is when it falls on a Sunday, during Holy Week or Easter Week. It was once seen as a Marian feast, probably because of the conversation between Mary and the Archangel Gabriel as he announced she would be the mother of the Savior, thus having a lower rank than solemnities of the Lord like Christmas, which always stays on December 25 no matter the day of the week. These reasons likely contribute to Annunciation not being a holy day of obligation. And since there is no obligation and it can never be on a Sunday, the vast majority of Catholics never celebrate it.

Finally, we live in a time where little humans in the womb are not protected, and we are trying to show the world they are precious boys and girls made in God’s image. Imagine how we could change hearts if we pointed out the Jesus we adore at Christmas was alive nine months before he was born. For this reason, St. John Paul II designated March 25 as the International Day of the Unborn.

Thanks for your prayers as the priests of the Archdiocese renew our promises at the Chrism Mass this Tuesday. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.

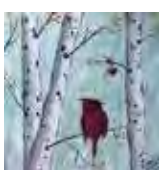

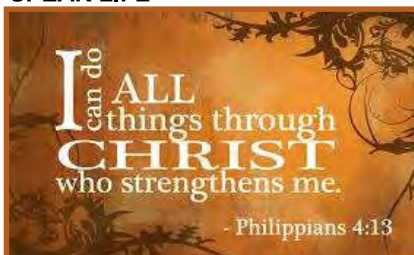

LITURGICAL COLORS



Although we are still in our last days of the Lenten season, today we usher Holy Week in with a color

change. Today is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, so we appropriately switch to red for the blood and Passion of our Lord. Lent will end this week when the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday begins. This Lenten ending begins the Sacred Triduum. We mark this beginning and ending by shedding our Lenten purple for solemn white. This is the day we celebrate the institution of the priesthood and the institution of the Holy Eucharist. White is the appropriate color for Sacramental celebrations.

After the Blessed Sacrament is processed and adoration begins, the church and altar will be stripped of the white and left naked, just as Christ was left naked on the cross. The Good Friday Passion of the Lord celebration will be marked with the bare altar, but red vestments again for the passion of Christ. Saturday, though, the church will be completely transformed for the Easter Vigil. After the starkness of Lent, we will be greeted by a beautifully decorated church in joyful, triumphant white, regal gold and a kaleidoscope of newly blooming spring flowers—signs of Christ's resurrection and victory over death.

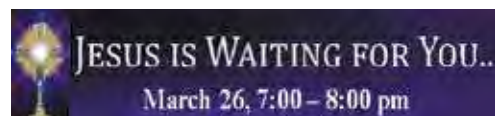

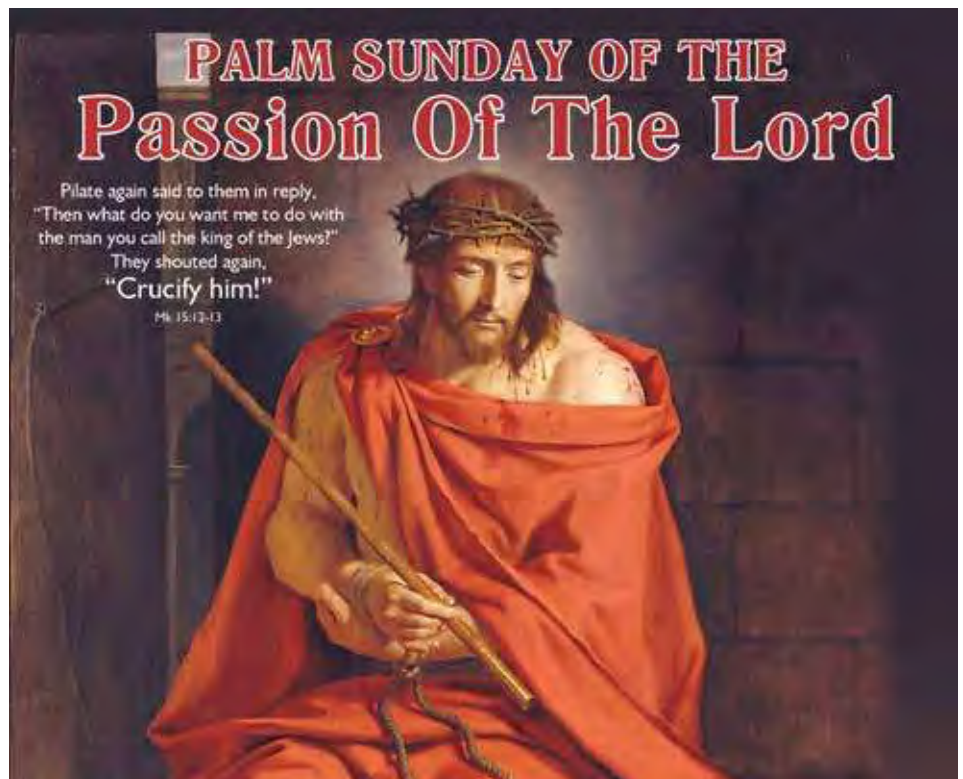
