

SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY

Beloved in Christ,

Please see the times for Divine Mercy Holy Hours on Sunday afternoon listed on **page 14**. Visit thedivinemercy.org to find out more about this devotion.

This Monday, April 8, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. We will have Mass at St. Luke at 8:30 a.m. and Mary, Help of Christians at 9 a.m. This solemnity marks some very profound mysteries for the Christian Faith:

- It is the beginning of the life of Jesus, so Christmas is in nine months.
- It marks the beginning of His priesthood and victimhood.
- It marks the mystery of the Incarnation, God in human flesh. Because of this we will genuflect in the Creed where we normally bow. This gesture is also done on Christmas.
- It marks the mystery of the Hypostatic Union. In the one person of Jesus Christ, there are two natures: Human and Divine. God never had a body before the Annunciation, but he does now and will for all eternity in the person of Jesus Christ.

Anthropology is the fancy word for the study of human nature. We have a great opportunity to witness something profound on Monday during the eclipse. Because of animal instinct, chickens will likely head to the coop where they sleep as it begins to get dark. However, we human beings have a will that we can control. We can learn things about ourselves and the world around us. We can decide whether or not we give in to the things we might instinctively be drawn to do.

Thanks for your prayers. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.



Eucharistic Adoration & Confession Tuesday, April 9, 7 pm



On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. In 1930, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. The Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed.

The Divine Mercy Image

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white emanate from his rays heart. symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy

The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you" (Diary, no. 1541). "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy" (Diary, no. 687).
