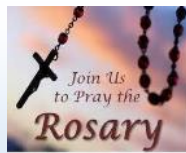

The Ascension of the Lord will be celebrated on the Seventh Sunday of Easter in Ohio dioceses.

With permission from Rome, the Catholic bishops of Ohio decided to move the yearly celebration of the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord from Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter to the Seventh Sunday of Easter.

This change has been in effect since June 4, 2000.

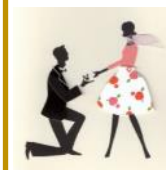

## Catholic Action Plan to Defeat Proposed Abortion Amendment to Ohio's Constitution

April 27, 2023

Dear Pastor/Pastoral Administrator/Deacon:

As mentioned in the Ohio Bishops' [February letter](#), a proposed amendment to Ohio's Constitution for a vote on the November 2023 ballot expands and enshrines abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Church must not be silent and cannot remain on the sidelines when confronted with such a clear threat to human life and dignity. We must engage and mobilize Catholics statewide to defeat this proposed amendment and its potential grave consequences for Ohio's future.

To encourage faithful citizenship on the amendment, the Catholic Conference of Ohio, in collaboration with the dioceses and eparchies in the state, is launching a statewide Catholic campaign specifically to ensure Catholics register to vote and vote no if the amendment appears on the November 2023 ballot.

**Every parish in Ohio is asked to unite in prayer, distribute educational materials, and encourage voter registration to Vote NO on the abortion expansion amendment.**

The statewide campaign is designed to assist you, your parish staff, and volunteers with running a prayerful and educational effort until voting ends on November 7. Each parish will be mailed a starter packet next week with the following:

- **Bulletin/Newsletter Post** – announces the proposed amendment, campaign, and materials.
- **Prayer Cards** – we encourage parishes to pray this as a community before or after Mass and distribute to every Mass-going parishioner.
- **Educational Flyer** – introduces the amendment and outlines the dangerous content; this can be inserted into your bulletin or set out in a gathering space for easy parishioner access.

Additional materials will be released in upcoming months, including a Parish Resource Kit to help coordinate your efforts. Each diocese will also produce unique resources. Digital copies of all campaign materials and other helpful resources can be found on the **Protect Them Both** campaign site:

## FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

### Help Protect the Dignity of Life in Ohio

Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution for the November 2023 ballot to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that “human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception.” The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like Walking with Moms in Need and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio. Starting this week, the following **Protect Them Both** materials about the proposed amendment are available in Ohio parishes:
