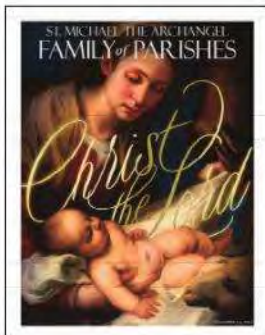

Even though this is the bulletin for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, it's also Christmas Eve; so, I will offer a joyous Merry Christmas!

I hope you are able to celebrate the Christmas season to the fullest. Even though the world out there celebrates Christmas during Advent and puts away Christmas decorations on the second day of Christmas, we have an octave of eight days and a whole liturgical season for celebrating the birth of our Savior. "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is the old song reminding us of the importance of celebrating Christmas at least until the Solemnity of the Epiphany, which falls on Jan. 7 this year.

Though the Christmas Season ends with the Baptism of the Lord on Jan. 8, our celebration of Christmas does not have to end there. Some people maintain the custom of celebrating Christmas for 40 days until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on Feb. 2.

Liturgical Colors

After our four weeks of Advent purple, we arrive on Christmas Eve to see our church beautifully decorated for the Christmas season. Our liturgical colors for Christmas are white and gold. In the secular world the colors of Christmas are green and red, so it is common to see these colors in the church, also—mainly in the popular red poinsettias and the green trees. If you read our article during the Easter season, you learned that white symbolizes Christ, purity, victory over death and joy among other things, and therefore, is used for our most holy solemnities and seasons, as well as baptisms and funerals. Our Christmas season continues until the Baptism of the Lord, which follows Epiphany. At that point, we enter the first round of Ordinary Time, which means measured, numbered time. (You may remember that we celebrated the long second round of Ordinary Time after the Easter Season.) Green symbolizes the hope we have with faith.

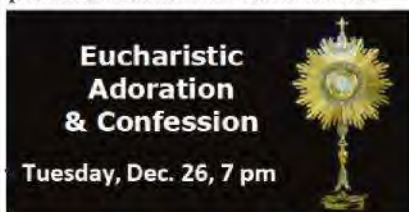

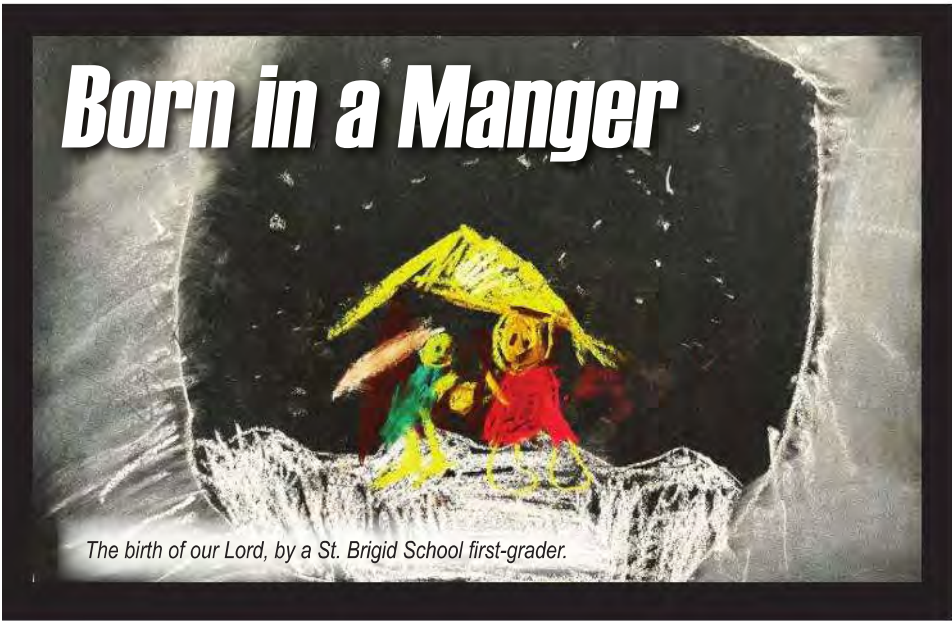

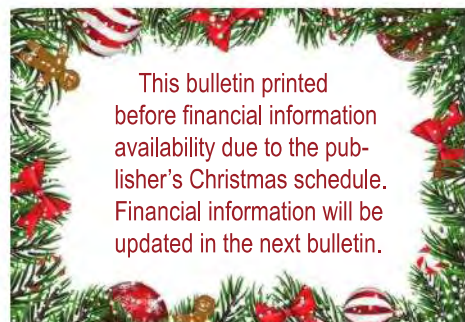
